- Friends, family, baking, nature, pets, crafts and music all feature widely in our museum.






















Good Luck to Year 8

Just over 5 weeks ago, Mr Van Der Merwe sent out a 'road map' to all staff explaining how we would like to move our online learning forward. At the time, one of the potential outcomes was that we might have a few videos on a secure website to do with lessons and a zoom call for each form if possible. Today we have over 100 videos. Not only have we had lessons for ICT, Music, English and French, we have

managed to have a virtual sports day, a trip down memory lane with the museum of happiness, a musical extravaganza (still to be published!), a virtual induction for our new Y5 students, Key Stage assemblies and a special 'waves' video. We have had videos submitted by families and, all-in-all,

we have surpassed our expectations and then some. We have completed Zoom catch-ups for all tutor groups and have managed to add in some additional Zoom sessions for our Year 5 students as they move into Year 6 – giving them a chance to meet with their new tutors. If you like listening to audiobooks, try out the English department reading to you. There is a huge thank you to say to staff for all the hours they have put into making videos – it takes a long time to get the videos right and to edit them. We also say a huge thank you to everyone that has helped on the technical front. From reception fielding calls of 'lost zoom calling parents', to Miss Watson sending out countless letters about Zoom meetings and Thomas in IT solving every problem that we have created. For some families, there has been a demand for even more online support – it has been a learning curve for us all and I know that we will continue to explore this new way of learning. September!

In line with the Government guidance, we have continued our planning for all students returning from September. You will find some detailed notes about how we intend to operate in a separate document. We will send out a reminder and some further notes before the start of term. Please remember that we are having a phased return during the first week of term:

- Monday, 7th September Year 5 only
- Tuesday, 8th September Year 5 and 6 only
- Wednesday, 9th September all Year groups.

Please be aware that these dates may be different to other local schools – our dates are in line with Central Bedfordshire and Bedford Borough dates. We are only delaying our original start dates for some year groups by 1-2 days and hope you appreciate the reasons for this. It will enable us to establish routines and explain procedures to students. There are some aspects of our planning that we will develop over the Summer (especially arrangements for lunchtime – this will be one of our key areas of challenge and we will need all students to help and co-operate with our arrangements). There are some measures that will be for a short time and everything is dependent on the situation with Covid-19 and subject to change in the light of any subsequent Government guidance. Thank you in advance for your patience and understanding.

Please re-assure students that they have nothing to worry about – they will undoubtedly be anxious in the lead-up to September, but, once we get them into their tutor groups and we start with some learning, they will be fine. Please go through the guidance notes with the children and we will send some further information (and hopefully a video message) before the start of term.



Charitable donation

During Lockdown, we have had several families who have been unable to access our online learning as they did not have a laptop at home. Only a few students were eligible for the DfE laptop scheme so we have been exploring other ways of funding some laptops which we could loan to families. We have just received confirmation of a donation of £8,000 from the Gale Family Charity Trust. This will enable us to purchase 20 new laptops which we will be able to

loan to families while at Holywell. We are truly grateful for this generous contribution.

Cathedral Thinking

At the start of the year, we had a focus on the concept of cathedral thinking – basically, planning with the end in mind! There is also a very interesting story that came from the rebuilding of St. Paul's. One morning, Sir Christopher Wren, who was not personally known by many of the workers, stopped and asked three different labourers, all engaged in the same task, what they were doing.



He got three different answers.

- The first said, "I am cutting this stone."
- The second answered, "I am earning three shillings, six pence a day."
- The third man straightened up, squared his shoulders, and still holding his mallet and chisel, replied, "I am helping Sir Christopher Wren build this great cathedral in praise of God."

Each worker had three different ways of looking at the same job.

- The first one was just doing a task.
- The second one was just earning a living.
- The third was doing a small part of a great work. He did not personally know the architect or understand how his task fitted into the overall plan but he believed that there was a plan and that by following it, he would help create something greater than himself.

At the start of the year, we challenged students and staff to think about how their work at Holywell is part of a bigger endeavour. In a way, what we have been doing during Lockdown has been similar. All of the sacrifices, adjustments, amendments we have made could be viewed as 'just doing as we are told', they could be seen as keeping ourselves safe ... or we could think about the bigger picture: we have all been working together to defeat Covid-19 and to keep everyone on the planet safe from this deadly virus. Through the coming Summer months and as lockdown measures are eased, please remember the 'long-term goal' – be brave, but be safe and stay alert.
